SCHOODIC LAKE TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Tournament Committee

- The committee has full authority over rule enforcement and interpretation.
- They can inspect boats at any time and participate in the tournament.
- All rulings are final, except as defined by Maine law.

2. Registration & Check-In

- All competitors must sign in 30 minutes before start time and have their boats ready for inspection.
- Boats must display proof of registration and inspection.
- Teams must remain the same throughout the day—no swapping of partners after sign-in.
- Only two competitors are allowed per boat, except when fishing with **youth and/or family members**, which requires prior approval. Youth anglers can enter the "Youth Lunker" division – lunker can be included with team's final weight.
- Competitors under 16 years old must fish with a parent or guardian.
- At least one adult per team must attend the rules meeting before the tournament begins.

3. Takeoff & Check-In Procedures

- Takeoff order is determined by a random draw at registration. No switching positions.
- Boats must return inside the check-in point by the tournament's end.
- Late penalties: 1-pound deduction per minute (up to 15 minutes), then disqualification.
- If a boat breaks down, competitors can transfer their fish to another competitor's boat but must notify the committee immediately.

4. Safety Regulations

- Life jackets must be worn and fully fastened whenever the boat's motor is running.
- The kill switch must be attached to the operator.
- All boats must have US Coast Guard-required safety equipment.

5. Boat Horsepower Limits

- Maximum horsepower is 250 HP and cannot exceed the rating on the boat's USCG plate.

6. Sportsmanship & Conduct

- Competitors must follow Maine Fish & Wildlife laws, state boating laws, and tournament rules.
- No alcohol or drugs are allowed on boats, and no drinking before weigh-in.
- Any unsportsmanlike conduct may lead to disqualification.

7. Permitted Fishing Areas

- Fishing is allowed anywhere on the lake without removing boats from the water.
- Anglers must stay in their boats except for emergencies.
- Boats cannot be lifted over obstacles unless using legal means (motor, paddle, or pole).
- 50-yard rule: Boats must stay at least 50 yards from another competitor's boat if it has its trolling motor stowed and anchor down.

8. Fishing Rules & Equipment

- Only largemouth and smallmouth bass count. Minimum size: 12 inches.
- Limit: 5 fish per team.
- Only artificial lures allowed (no live bait).
- One rod per angler at a time; no trolling or wind-drifting.
- All boats must have an aerated live well (coolers with aeration allowed).

9. Scoring & Weigh-In

- Only bass caught during tournament hours can be weighed.
- Competitors must stay together until their fish are weighed.
- Use non-penetrating culling devices to protect fish.
